Some tinfoil

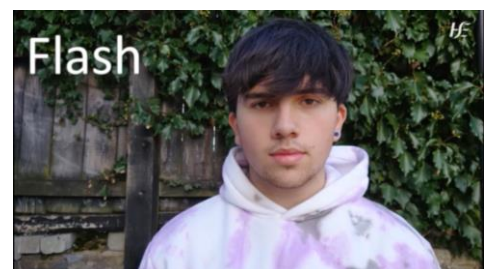
A large book or chopping

2. Here, we are looking at the difference of using flash or no flash in bright settings

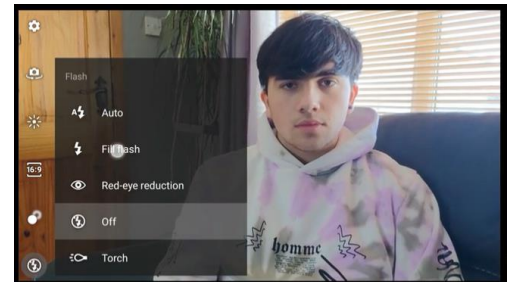
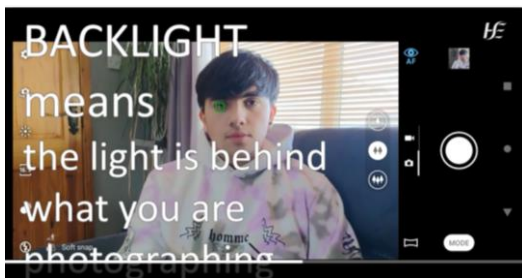




3. It's still important to have some light, as we can see below it can appear to light or to dark



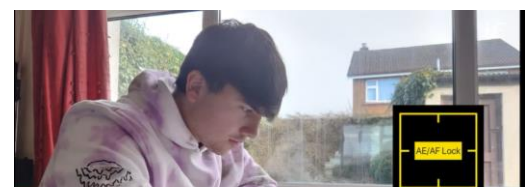
4. Looking at backlight when taking pictures, the light shining through the window can effect the quality of our picture. Turning off our flash for pictures like this is important



5. As we can see below, the quality of the picture improves. Focusing our cameras on our models or objects is also important like Anna explains holding the focuses on the models face improves the photo quality

1. Always use AE/AF
2. Make sure to clean your camera lens
3. Keep both arms and elbows tucked into our sides
4. Talk to your model tell them what to do and where to look
