Talk: ask for help

If you have immediate concern for your own or another person's safety i.e. risk of suicide is expressed or suspected, it is important to communicate this clearly with the service provider upon contact, as an emergency appointment may be required. Practical support and /or guidance from the service provider may also be needed or requested at this time.
