## Bereavement Counselling Information

The Regional Suicide Resource Office provides bereavement counselling for persons over 16 years of age who have been bereaved through sudden traumatic deaths in the South Eastern area of the HSE.

The HSE contracts Counsellors who are fully accredited and have Garda Clearance, professional indemnity insurance and attend regular supervision of their work.

They also work within the Department of Health's "Children First" Guidelines in relation to the protection of children. Persons must be bereaved through one of the following circumstances to access the service:

- Suicide
- Homicide
- Road Traffic Accident
- Industrial/Agricultural/Domestic Accident
- Drowning

Referral must be made in writing to the Co-ordinator, Bereavement Counselling Service at the address overleaf and include the following information:

Initially, the client will be offered up to twelve bereavement counselling sessions which will then be reviewed between the Counsellor and the HSE designated officer.
