A statement about the effectiveness of the approved centre's actions to eliminate, where possible, and reduce physical restraint

Cavan APU is committed to reducing episodes of physical restraint to their lowest possible level. The training the staff engage in annually focuses on the professional management of complex behaviours and dealing with these behaviours before they reach a crisis point eliminating the need for restraint. Sometimes restraint is unavoidable and when this must occur staff have been taught different levels of restraint and the restraint used is the always the least restrictive possible.

All clinical staff in Cavan APU have been trained in the use of the Brøset Violence Checklist (BVC). This is a key component in the service's strategy to reduce and minimise the use of physical restraint in the Approved Centre.

A statement about the approved centre's compliance with the code of practice on the use of physical restraint

Cavan APU has processes in place to review each episode of physical restraint at unit level after the restraint occurs. CMMHS has a MHC Compliance officer who reviews each restraint and the documentation relating to each restraint. Cavan APU has a Restraint Reduction Oversight Group made up of staff from the APU, members of Senior Management and members of Practice Development who meet quarterly and review any restraints that have occurred and the corresponding audits. Specific actions for improvement are identified and implemented to improve compliance with the code of practice on the use of physical restraint.

A statement about the compliance with the approved centre's own reduction policy

Cavan APU staff, the Restraint Reduction Oversight Group and the MHC Compliance officer are dedicated to reducing the amount of physical restraint to the lowest possible level. Every episode of restraint is reviewed in detail to examine if any learning can be taken from it to prevent reoccurrence in the future. This Learning is passed onto the APU staff and also the instructors of PMCB (Professional Management of Complex Behaviours)
