A statement about the effectiveness of the approved centre's actions to eliminate, where possible, and reduce physical restraint

An Coillin adopts a comprehensive approach to minimising physical restraint. This strategy includes fostering a **least-restrictive culture**, creating a **recovery-focused therapeutic environment**, providing ongoing education, engaging service users and ensuring strong governance. Physical restraint is used only as an absolute last resort to ensure safety, for the shortest possible duration, to ensure safety. Each episode of physical restraint is thoroughly reviewed by the **Multidisciplinary Team (MDT)**, with feedback from those involved actively sought and encouraged to inform future improvements. All episodes are discussed during **MDT meetings**, to identify opportunities for improvement and continuous learning. An Coillin continually refines its restrictive practice reduction strategy through regular reviews and updates. Personalised activities and therapeutic interventions are provided to meet individual's specific needs ensuring every effort is made to minimise physical restraint.

A statement about the approved centre's compliance with the code of practice on the use of physical restraint

An Coillin adheres fully to the **Code of Practice on the Use of Physical Restraint.** All physical restraint practices are conducted in line with regulatory guidelines, ensuring restraint is only used as a last resort when all alternative interventions have been exhausted and the individual presents an immediate risk of harm. Each instance of physical restraint is reviewed by the **Multidisciplinary Team (MDT)** within five working days, with compliance consistently monitored through **audits.** Any non-compliance is swiftly identified and addressed, with corrective actions implemented to maintain adherence to the Code of Practice. The Centre ensures transparency and accountability through regular reporting and oversight at the MDT Review and Oversight Committee for Restrictive Practices meetings, reaffirming its commitment to best practices and compliance in the use of physical restraint.



A statement about the compliance with the approved centre's own reduction policy

An Coillin fully complies with the **Seclusion and Physical Restraint Reduction Policy**. Each instance of physical restraint is reviewed by the **Multidisciplinary Team (MDT)** to ensure compliance with the policy, with any areas for improvement promptly addressed. Ongoing **quarterly audits** and continuous staff training further support adherence to the policy's principles. An Coillin's dedication to reducing and where possible, eliminating physical restraint is evident in its proactive implementation of preventive strategies and alternative interventions. Regular reporting and oversight ensure continued compliance, reinforcing An Coillin's commitment to minimising restrictive practices while preserving the dignity and well-being of service users.
