While the aim of our restrictive practice reduction policy strategy is to eliminate and reduce physical restraint in our Approved Centre in Cappahard Lodge. Since the last report there has been just one episode where one of our residents were subject to physical restraint. This has been a 33% reduction in physical restraint.

A statement about the approved centre's compliance with the code of practice on the use of physical restraint

Our recent draft 2024 MHC inspection report for Cappahard Lodge revealed non-compliance, low risk rating with physical restraint.

- a) The multi-disciplinary review and oversight committee did not identify the actions, the persons responsible and the timeframes for the completion of any actions
- b) In two episodes of physical restraint inspected, it was not recorded in the clinical file whether the consultant psychiatrist or duty consultant psychiatrist was notified as soon as was practicable, c) In two episodes of physical restraint inspected, the person being restrained was not informed of the reasons for, and the circumstances which would lead to, the discontinuation of physical restraint, 3.8.

A statement about the compliance with the approved centre's own reduction policy

There was compliance with our restrictive practice reduction policy and strategy. All alternatives to physical restraint and any area for improvement were considered. There was an immediate risk to self and/or others. Our approved centre at Cappahard strives to reduce and/or eliminate restraint. We have implemented an open door policy, which the research has shown is some area assisted with reducing violence and aggression and risk to others which we hope will contribute to a reduction in restraint within our approved centre.
