

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Foreword

I am very pleased to issue the fourth edition of *You Are Not Alone:*Directory of Bereavement Support Services. In Connecting for Life, our National Strategy for Suicide Prevention 2015-2020, we recognise that when we lose someone close to us, not only must we deal with many practical issues, we are also faced with the huge emotional challenges of making sense of the death and trying to shape our lives to accommodate our loss. This booklet and its companion - *You Are Not Alone: Help and Advice on coping with the death of someone close* - are intended to provide guidance and support during a difficult time. These resources were developed to help people bereaved by suicide. However, the information and support services may also be of use to individuals and families who have been bereaved in other ways.

This directory lists the individual counsellors and organisations across the country providing services to those who are bereaved. These range from local support groups, self-help groups, voluntary and community-based groups to larger organisations with multiple branches.

The companion booklet, *You Are Not Alone: Help and Advice on coping with the death of someone close* contains practical advice and information on our reactions to death, and the various financial and legal matters that must be dealt with after bereavement.

In 2012, the HSE National Office for Suicide Prevention, in conjunction with Console and Turas le Chéile, published *National Quality Standards* for the Provision of Suicide Bereavement Services: A Practical Resource (2012). This document provides a framework for the delivery of suicide bereavement support services in Ireland, recognising the four levels of service delivery. It can be accessed in the resource section of **www.nosp.ie**.

I would like to thank all of the individuals and organisations who provided their information for this directory, and who continue to provide support and assistance to those who are bereaved. I would also like to say special thanks to the HSE Resource Officers for Suicide Prevention who collated the information in their geographical areas.

Introduction

Although everyone's reaction to be reavement is different, most people experience some of the following feelings when someone close to them dies:

- Disbelief
- Depression
- Shock
- Anxiety
- Despair

- Sadness
- Longing
- Relief
- Loneliness
- Anger

You might experience some of these feelings for differing lengths of time – everyone's experience is different. Often, the first responses to a death – even one that has long been expected – are disbelief, shock and anger. These may lessen in time and can be followed by a sense of guilt, depression, anxiety and despair. You might also feel an acute sense of longing for the dead person, hopelessness at the thought of their absence, loneliness and sadness at their loss or even a sense of relief that they are gone (which may, in turn, lead to feelings of guilt).

Some physical symptoms experienced after bereavement can be quite acute and distressing. It is important to realise that these are normal parts of the grieving process and will pass in time.

Physical reactions may include:

- · Loss of energy and interest in life;
- An inability to sleep or constant tiredness;
- Poor concentration and forgetfulness;
- Loss of appetite or compulsive comfort eating;
- An inability to cry or a tendency to continuously burst into tears;
- Nausea and/or diarrhoea;
- Headaches and unexplained body pains.

There are many bereavement services and support groups throughout the country: public and private, professional and voluntary, religious and secular (non-religious). If you are religious, there may be pastoral care available in your local community. You should make contact through the relevant place of worship.

This directory provides information and contact details for organisations that offer support to the bereaved. Some organisations have several branches. These are listed for each organisation and also in the relevant listing for each county. Other organisations provide a more limited service to a specific area or in terms of the hours that the service may be available.

If you are looking for support following a bereavement, consider talking to your GP in the first instance.

Note: Please read the disclaimer at the end of this directory before using any of the listed services.

National Quality Standards for the Provision of Suicide Bereavement Services: A Practical Resource (2012)

The National Quality Standards Resource sets out standards for all levels of suicide bereavement support services in Ireland. It is a resource to be used by services or organisations to examine, improve and validate the services they provide.

It shows how to identify which standards apply to individual services and helps service providers assess what action needs to be implemented to put the standards in place.

The standards relate directly to the area of suicide bereavement supports and services and do not take into account other requirements and the needs of specific groups or minorities, such as children.

Organisations are advised to follow all other relevant standards and legislation that apply to their specific area of work.

The HSE National Office for Suicide Prevention collaborated with Console, the national agency providing supports and services for those bereaved by suicide in Ireland, and Turas le Chéile bereavement support services, to develop the National Quality Standards.

The objectives for the project included:

- develop national standards for organisations and groups to deliver services to people bereaved through suicide in Ireland;
- test these standards within Console and Turas le Chéile;
- draw on available national/international best practice and evidence and existing research and proposals;
- liaise with the International Association for Suicide Prevention sub-group on postvention.

The National Quality Standards outline a number of steps for organisations to follow so as to determine whether they meet the standards, and to assess what actions need to be taken to put the standards in place.

- Ten guiding principles are set out which should underpin all services provided for those bereaved by suicide.
 Organisations are asked to reflect on whether they subscribe to these principles.
- 2. There are four different levels of service delivery, ranging from Information Services (level 1) to Psychotherapy (level 4). Organisations are provided with information to determine at which level they operate. Eleven questions are provided, to help services determine this. These questions relate to the service's aims, target group, delivery of services, and staff.
- 3. Once the level of service delivery is known, the organisation can then conduct an assessment of their service. Standards are set out for each of the four levels of service. The number of standards varies according to the service level.

Each standard refers to examples of policies and practices that indicate how a service might develop compliance with that standard. Proformas and summary sheets are provided, which allow the organisation to track their record over time.

The framework document is intended to be used as a living document, which records the organisation's achievement of the various standards. It is not expected that any organisation will meet the standards from the outset, but that they will use them as a target.

It is intended that the National Quality Standards will be invaluable to new organisations setting up, and to established organisations that are ready to reflect on their achievements to date and set goals for the future.





- The funeral;
- · The inquest;
- Entitlements;
- What to say to children;
- How to deal with the neighbours;
- Help the person to clarify their personal grief;
- Connect the person to other support services in their area;
- Provide information on suicide and attempted suicide;
- Be there, as a friend, for the person.

Perhaps you may have specific questions about some of the difficult practical issues following a death by suicide.

You may want guidance or assistance in accessing a therapeutic service, or even just to talk with someone locally, about what has happened. In some cases, there may be a specific concern about the reactions and emotions family members or the wider community are experiencing. In any case, we welcome your call.


Our online and face-to-face services are available to all parents, no matter what the age or circumstances of your child's death. They are available for as long as you need them.

Barnardos Children's Bereavement Service is a service for children and young people who have lost someone close to them – like a parent or a sibling – through death. While we can't shield children from the reality of death and the pain of loss, we can help them to understand, to grieve and to cope a little better.

It may take some time for a child to talk about death, but getting support and being listened to helps the healing. Barnardos Children's Bereavement Service is here to help. We work with families to help them to support their child through the grieving process.

Barnardos Children's Bereavement Service is supported by the Family Support Agency, Commission for the Support of Victims of Crime and ESB Electric Aid.

There are a number of services that we provide:

Barnardos Bereavement Helpline Service: (01) 473 2110

This unique service is for members of the public seeking information and support.

Volunteers operate the daily telephone service, open from 10am-12pm Monday to Thursday. Full training and support is provided.

Therapeutic Intervention

Specialist bereavement project workers are based in Cork and Dublin and work with children from these catchment areas. We welcome referrals to our services from a number of different avenues:

- Referrals will be accepted from any source with the consent of parents/carers.
- Parents and carers are welcome to contact us directly.
- Referrals can be made through the Helpline or by contacting our services in Cork and Dublin.

 Other agencies can make referrals using the Barnardos Bereavement referral form. This is available on request bereavement@barnardos.ie

The service offered is based on the individual needs of each child and their family. Our service takes into consideration the developmental stage of the child, the child's relationship with the deceased, the nature of the death and particular circumstances of the family.

Training and Consultancy




