

Three-day workshop in Evidence Based Practice

Tuesday March 12th – Thursday March 14th 2019

Aim and objectives:

This three-day workshop aims to introduce participants to the principles of evidence based practice:

- To know the steps of evidence based practice
- To be able to formulate an answerable clinical question
- To be able to search and find the best available evidence to answer their clinical question
- To understand how to critically appraise different types of research studies and clinical guidelines
- To introduce the principles of generating recommendations for practice, based on the best available evidence, integrated with clinical expertise and patient values
- To be able to plan for implementation of evidence into practice.

Participants:

Participants will work in the health and social care services in Ireland and/or teach evidence based practice in Ireland. A network of practitioners and teachers of Evidence Based Practice (EBP) in Ireland is being developed, to create an EBP community and facilitate networking and resource-sharing. Participants on this three day EBP workshop will be invited to actively participate in this network.

Participants must come with the outline of a clinical question/query. During the course participants will search for an answer to their clinical question/query. Participants will be required to submit a short report in June 2019 on how they put the evidence they found into practice in their workplace.
