

1. Testing Volumes and Turnaround Times



Test and Trace Volumes

The following metrics and turnaround times refer to the seven days from 2nd – 8th June.



• Total Community Referrals (including walk-ins and self-referrals) were c.65,523, which has decreased by 9.8% in comparison to the same time-frame last week (26th May – 1st June; c.72,643 total referrals).



Total Swabs Completed

• From the 2nd – 8th June, c.118,815 swabs were completed across community, walk-in, serial testing and acute sites.



Lab Tests and Detected Rate from 2nd – 8th June

- There was c.127,504 lab tests completed over the past week.
- The average detected rate over the past week is approximately 3%.



Contact Tracing

- Over the last 7 days, of those tested with close contacts, the average number close contacts was 3.7 per person.
- From 2nd 8th June a total of 2,575 calls were completed to inform individuals of their detected COVID-19 test result.
- From 2nd 8th June, contact tracing was completed for c.2,338 individuals that had a confirmed COVID-19 case
- In addition, c.6,019 calls were made to close contacts.



Test and Trace Turnaround Times

The following metrics and turnaround times refer to the 7 day date range from 2nd – 8th June.



Turnaround Times

- The combined median time from swab to lab result in community and acute settings was 23 hours.
- All contact tracing calls are completed within a mean of 8.7 hours and a median of 6.2 hours.
- In the last seven days, in the community, we have delivered a median end to end turnaround time of 1 day for not detected results.
- In the last seven days, in the community, we have delivered a median end to end turnaround time of 1.9 days for detected results.




Total Community Referrals

(Including walk-ins)

- From the 2nd 8th June, there were a total of c. 65,523 Community Referrals (including walk-ins). This weekly total has decreased by 9.8% in comparison to the same time-period last week (26th May 1st June; c.72,643 total referrals).
- The graph to the right shows a daily breakdown of total community and walk-in referrals over the past 7 days.

Self-Referral Portal Pilot

There are currently 4 self-referral pilot COVID 19 testing sites in operation in Citywest, Swords, Letterkenny and Limerick.

As of the 8th of June:

- The overall positivity rate at self-referral sites over the past 7 days was 4.1%.
- The age group with the highest positivity rate was the 15-24 year old group (8.1%).






Overall Positivity Trend




- The positivity rate for the past seven days is c.

Serial Testing in Nursing Homes

In Cycle 12;




524 facilities have been tested

In Cycle 5;




11 facilities have been tested

In Cycle 10;




27 facilities have been tested

Mandatory Hotel Quarantine Testing

- All passengers arriving into Ireland from designated states are required to pre-book accommodation in a designated quarantine facility.
- Testing resources have been made available in Quarantine Facilities since 26th March 2021, and are available on a daily basis to accommodate the testing of all new arrivals.
- The scope of testing includes:
 - Testing of passengers arriving into Ireland from Category 2 Countries on Day 0 and Day 10
 - Testing of passengers arriving into Ireland from Category 1 Countries that have not been able to produce a negative result
 - Testing of Quarantine Hotel Staff on a weekly basis

Of these 938 staff; 885 of these staff have been hired and retained as part of dedicated workforce to support the contact tracing function

The remaining 53 staff are redeployed from the HSE and other Public Service Roles





Testing of Close Contacts

• Close contacts of a detected case will receive a text message with their appointment details and should attend at the time assigned to them, and **not** arrive as a walk-in.

 Ensuring close contacts are identified and tested quickly is imperative so that necessary action can be taken to protect others and supress COVID 19 in our communities.





As of the 1st of June, the overall positivity rate is 3%.



Our median end to end turnaround time is 1.9 days for detected cases and 1 day for not detected cases.



Total Community Referral Volumes have decreased by 9.8% in comparison to the same time-period last week
