1. Testing Volumes and Turnaround Times



Test and Trace Volumes

The following metrics and turnaround times refer to the seven days from 5th – 11th May.



Community Referrals and Total Swabs Taken

- Community Referrals (GP and CTC) were c.40,290, which has increased by 1% in comparison to the same time-frame last week (28th April 4th May; c.39,794 community referrals).
- Walk-In Referrals were c.11,713, an increase of 4% in comparison to the same time-frame last week (28th April 4th May; c.11,214 walk-in referrals)
- From the 5th 11th May, over 128,024 swabs were taken across community, acutes and serial testing.
- 94.8% of GP referrals are provided with a COVID-19 test appointment within 24 hours.
- From 26th April 2nd May of those close contacts who were referred for Test 1, attendance was 90%.
- From 19th 25th April, of those close contacts who were referred for Test 2, attendance was 88%.



Laboratories

- Laboratories processed **130,697 tests** across our network of 46 labs.
- The average detected rate over the past week is approximately 2.4%.



Contact Tracing

- Of the close contacts identified between 26th April 2nd May who underwent Test 1 and whose results were available, 11.9% were positive. By circumstances of contact, positivity rates remain highest in this cohort for household close contacts where it is 25.5%.
- Over the last 7 days, of those tested with close contacts, the average number close contacts was 3.5 per person.
- From 5th 11th May a total of 2,902 calls were completed to individuals who received a confirmed COVID-19 detected test result.
- From 5th 11th May, contact tracing was completed for c.2,608 individuals that had a confirmed COVID-19 case
- In addition, c.4,718 calls were made to close contacts.



Test and Trace Turnaround Times

The following metrics and turnaround times refer to the 7 day date range from 5th – 11th May.



Turnaround Times

- The combined median time from swab to lab result in community and acute settings was 22 hours.
- All contact tracing calls are completed within a mean of 7.8 hours and a median of 5.2 hours.
- In the last seven days, in the community, we have delivered a median end to end turnaround time of 1.3 days for not detected results.
- In the last seven days, in the community, we have delivered a median end to end turnaround time of 2.0 days for detected results.

Walk in - Test Centres (2/2)

Symptom Free Walk-In COVID-19 Testing

- Covid-19 walk-in test centres provide quicker and easier access to Covid-19 testing for asymptomatic people. They first opened on 26th March.
- To date (As of May 11th)
 - > A total of **70,211** people have been tested
 - ➤ The Overall positivity rate for walk in test centres is 3.5%
 - Over the past 7 days, the positivity rate for walk in test centres was 4.29%
 - Sites at Ballymun, Wexford and Longford have the highest positivity rates, at over 5%
 - ➤ The positivity rate was highest among the younger age groups (under 25)
 - > 2,394 detected cases have been identified








3. Testing and Trace Trends



Community & Walk-In Referrals

- From the 5th 11th May, there were **c.40,290** referrals in **community settings**. This weekly total has **increased by 1%** in comparison to the same time-period last week (28th April 4th May; c.39,794 community referrals).
- From the 5th 11th May, there were c.11,713 referrals for walk-in test centres. This weekly total has increased by 4% since the same timeperiod last week (28th April 4th May; c.11,214 walk-in referrals)
- The graph to the right shows a breakdown of total daily community and walk-in referrals over the past 7 days.








Community Referrals by Age Group

- From the 3rd 9th of May, the age group with the highest percentage of referrals was the 5-13 age group.
- The **5-13** age group made up **19.8%** of all referrals.
- The detected rate for the **5-13** age group was **c.4.8%.**






Swabs Completed in Community Test Centres

Swabs Completed in Community Test Centres (GP, Close Contact & Walk-In Tests)






Overall Positivity Trend



- The positivity rate for the past seven days is c.2.4%
- The positivity rate has decreased slightly from the same time-period last week (2.7%)




Close Contacts Trend

Over the last 7 days, of those tested with at least one close contact, the mean number of close contacts per person was 3.5

- Overall Close Contact Positivity Rate: 11.9%
- Household Positivity: 25.5%
- Social Positivity: 10.4%

In Cycle 11;




588 facilities have been tested



Mandatory Hotel Quarantine Testing

- All passengers arriving into Ireland from designated states are now required to pre-book accommodation in a designated quarantine facility.
- Testing resources have been made available in Quarantine Facilities since 26th March 2021, and are available on a daily basis to accommodate the testing of all new arrivals.
- The scope of testing includes:
 - Testing of passengers arriving into Ireland from Category 2 Countries on Day 0 and Day 10
 - Testing of passengers arriving into Ireland from Category 1 Countries that have not been able to produce a negative result
 - Testing of Quarantine Hotel Staff on a weekly basis



- In the last week the positivity rate in;
 - Primary schools was 2.3%
 - Post-primary schools was 0.9%
 - Special education schools was 3.1%
 - Childcare facilities was 4.2%



Of these 938 staff; 885 of these staff have been hired and retained as part of dedicated workforce to support the contact tracing function

Our median end to end turnaround time is 2.0 days for detected cases and 1.3 days for not detected cases.
