NATIONAL INTEGRATED OPERATIONS HUB:	An update was provided by the Chief Operations Officer, Ann O'Connor. Nursing homes remain the focus of the INOH. <u>Community Operations:</u> An update was provided by CCO, Ann O'Connor and ND Community Operations, David Walsh. Long Term Care Facilities (LTCF) are experiencing severe challenges with high levels of infection and reducing staff resources. Defence Force troops are currently being trained to assist in up but have not yet been deployed. NAS and Hospital Group provided assistance to a nursing home in Over the weekend. DW noted an urgent need to capture what staffing is available across all services in each ACMT impacted. The intention will be to have a team available on standby to intervene directly in an LTCF, if required.	Update to be provided at next meeting. Procurement:PPE deliveries into Ireland will resume 17/04/2020 with batch #2.Deliveries will initially be two flights for two days scaling to 5 air freight deliveries per day. IAG are trying to source two 747 cargo planes to increase the airfreight capacity and HSE also working with to have batch # 3 delivered earlier than planned.	
There is a particular supply issue with gowns. This was exacerbated when a shipment due for HSE was requisitioned in the UK by NHS.	
There are 200k – 210k gowns due in on flights over the coming days but demand remains very high.	
A test has been identified which can determine if a mask meets the respirator mask definition and its suitability for use in clinical environment. Masks delivered from China in a batch 1 have now been tested, have passed the test and are now available for distribution.	
Logistics teams have received a list of priority sites nationally in order	





to prioritise deliveries of critical PPE.	
A number of donations of PPE have been made to the HSE. Some larger donations have been sent to HSE	
distribution hub. This allows the	
HSE to test the donated PPE to	
ensure compliance and suitability	
for use prior to release to the system. Some donations have been	
made directly to care settings with	
no oversight from HSE procurement.	
This lack of visibility as to source,	
certification and efficacy of product	
can lead to risks if PPE is distributed within healthcare settings with no	
QA carried out.	
Donated ventilators are being QA checked by bio medical engineers	
prior to release to system.	
The Chief Clinical Officer, Dr Colm	
Henry, issued a letter to the system regarding use of PPE in the current	
climate.
