Workstream Updates:	Public Health: An update was provided by Lorraine Doherty, Clinical Lead HPSC. Cases continue to rise with data showing 267 cases detected between the 5 th and 18 th July 2020. He median age of cases is 33 years, with 69% of cases being less than 45 years of age. There have been further outbreaks in the Dublin region with one at a construction site and a further outbreak in a Direct Provision Centre. 10% in of cases in Kildare and 5% in Cork. Over 40 million cases of the virus have been notified globally with the US, Brazil, India and African continent being worst affected.

Test & Trace:

An update was provided by Niamh O'Beirne, HSE EMT. The take up of testing of close contacts of confirmed cases is becoming an issue. Non-take up rates on day one are at 20%, increasing to 50% on day 7. This may be due to the age and demographics of persons identified for testing, and the increasing rate of cases in the Dublin region.

There are two streams progressing at present:

1. Testing of Passengers at Airports/Ports:

Currently awaiting a formal recommendation from NPHET to set up testing site for symptomatic persons at airports. This has been issued in a memo to government for discussion by the cabinet committee.

2. Passenger Locator Form:

The HSE CIO and his teams are engaging with Microsoft to digitize the passenger locator form. Work is ongoing between
