New Outbreaks. 348 outbreaks noted on CIDR with 262 from private homes. 6 in nursing homes. 4 in vulnerable communities. 10 in hospitals (particularly in the east). 	Recruitment at 640 for tracers - aiming for 700 by next week. Capacity for over 1,000 cases and on track for 1,500 cases per day. Technology is in place to be deployed if needed – particular around close contacts. Link in place to allow close contacts make their own appointment for swabbing. Predicting capacity and a detailed plan to be available, including opening hours of testing, tracing, GP's OoH's etc. From the 8 <sup>th</sup> December - source investigation to commence – i.e. previous 7-day contact tracing to be capture. An increase in laboratory capacity is on track - 25,000 tests per day by end of December.

	Community services  Engagement is continuing with a Kerry nursing home - not escalated further — engagement continues with local providers.  6 new outbreaks in nursing homes.  1 area of concern due to scale of spread.  Week 5 of serial testing and positivity rate down to .35% v .5% last week.  Serial testing programme being reviewed for disability and psychiatry of Old Age — capacity planning over Christmas. 	10 new outbreaks in acute hospitals.  MC reported that the learning from previous outbreaks = early rapid responses and screening rather than an incremental approach. Letterkenny – testing continues.  LW reported that there was a call with SAOLTA and 138 staff are currently out with additional testing to take place today and tomorrow.  LW thanked MC for supporting microbiology over weekend.  MC noted that there is extensive testing going on in Letterkenny however it will get worse before it gets better.  LW continued to give an update with regard to the Private Hospital  Agreement and noted the following:  Meeting was taking place this afternoon with the DOH re: the safety net.
