5. PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE			
	KK: Epidemiological update. Number of cases continues to decline. Numbers remain high - daily cases similar to peak at wave 2 and 40% higher than peak at 1st wave. The number of outbreaks and hospital admissions are declining, but remain high - likely impact of level 5 restrictions and vaccination. 15,566 cases over last 14-day period. Median age 40yrs. 57.6% of cases <45yrs. National incidence rate of 326.89/100K.		Dr Lorraine Doherty

	Monaghan incidence rate has decreased, but remains highest rate in country at 692.3/100K. Hospitalisations: 1,182. ICU Admissions: 44. Deaths: 111. 829 new cases and 6 new deaths reported in last 24hrs, with median age of 84yrs. 3 deaths related to nursing home outbreaks. Workplace Outbreaks 5 in meat/poultry factory. 5 in construction. 14 in childcare and schools. Globally - USA, India and Brazil have the highest cumulative cases. USA, Brazil and Mexico have the highest deaths.		

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	UK Variant (VOC 202012/01) has been identified in 77 countries, approx. 50,000 cases. South African variant (501.V2) has been identified in 37 countries, approx. 990 cases. 10-12 cases in Ireland. Brazilian variant (P.1) has been identified in 14 countries, approx. 90 cases. Not yet identified in Ireland. No influenza/RSV in Ireland to date. Of note in last 3-4 weeks influenza and RSV is re-emerging in Australia as Winter starts, they had no influenza/RSV last year.		
6. COMMUNITY OPERATIONS			
	YO'N: Outbreak update circulated. Trend of outbreaks reducing - numbers remain high. 33% of nursing homes experiencing outbreaks, this was at 6% in mid-December 2020.		Yvonne O'Neill
7. ACUTE OPERATIONS			
	AF: Hospital admissions have reduced - ICU cases remain high. Private hospitals: good access to critical care beds, fully utilising the 30% of availability. Numbers of Bed Days Used (BDU) has increased last week, 1,900 compared to 1,600 previous week.		Liam Woods

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	Scope activity has decreased since first wave and has not fully recovered - focus on urgent cases. ICU beds in private hospitals is linked to demands for time dependent work, i.e. surgery. High numbers of patients being treated outside of ICU with non-invasive ventilation (NIV).		
8. TESTING & TRACING			
	Testing: Close contact testing on day 5 recommenced on 30/01/21, resulting in approx. 2,000 tests/day. The number of GP referrals has decreased. From tomorrow (10/02/21) reintroducing day 0 and day 10 testing for close contacts. The number for testing will be high for the next few days as the day 5 and day 0 tests happen simultaneously - there is sufficient capacity for both tests. Contact Tracing: Policy change: for text messages that is sent out - exit from restricted movement as a close contact between day 11 and 12, if tested negative. Full Participation Provider Agreement (PPA) will be reinstated from Wednesday 10/2/21.		Niamh O'Beirne
	Serial testing: On-going in nursing homes and meat factories. Collection of		

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	tests may be impacted by the severe weather forecasted, this will be factored into the processes. Acute Operations serial testing; meeting yesterday, re-assessing the serial testing in hospitals and the plan for same going forward. NPHET will be advised of their recommendations for same.
