6. COMMUNITY OPERATIONS			
	YO'N: The number of new outbreaks in LTRF has reduced. Approx. 27% of nursing homes experiencing an outbreak, previous at 33%. 6 new outbreaks in last week, seeing fewer cases linked to each outbreak.  Positive cases linked to an outbreak are being monitored, in particular where second dose of vaccinations have been administered.  Staff on COVID-19 leave: on average, there were 20 staff on leave related to each outbreak, this has reduced to an average of 8 staff per outbreak.  Disability and Mental Health facility outbreaks continue to decrease.		Yvonne O'Neill

One Dublin hospital had 19 positive staff out of approx. 3,900 staff tested in last week.  MC: W/e 21/02/21 there were 49 staff in acute hospital sector positive for COVID-19, compared to >1,000 previously.

	Testing: 418 lab positive cases yesterday, 150 less than last Monday. This is lowest daily number since early December 2020. Acute sector carrying out approx. 4,000 tests/day, 30,000/week. Private labs carrying out approx. 2-3,000 tests/day, 18,000/week - not detected results		Niamh O'Beirne
