	KK: Epidemiological update. Number of new cases slowly declining. Some activity linked to schools reopening. 3 rd level institutions - experiencing extended outbreaks. Most outbreaks in private homes. Internationally the disease is resurging, particularly in parts of Europe, linked to the B1.1.7 strain. 7,064 cases over last 14-day period. 	YO'N: Numbers continue to decline in nursing homes, with 3 outbreaks in the last 7 days. There were 7 outbreaks in other residential care facilities. On average, there are 4 staff on leave linked to each outbreak compared to 20 at peak of wave 3. 2-3 nursing homes being monitored closely; a significant decrease from approx. 100 at peak earlier this year.
