	KK: Case numbers are averaging between 12-1300 daily. Plateau not declining. Hospital numbers are slowly reducing and ICU admissions are static. Outbreaks are predominantly in schools. Monitoring international situation. 30/08/2021-12/09/2021 20,033 cases over last 14-day period. 1,394 new cases reported in last 24hrs. Median age 27yrs. 75.9% of cases <45yrs. National incidence rate of 420.7/100K. Counties with the highest 14-day incidence rate are Monaghan 1001.39/100,000 Donegal 866.9/100,000 Cavan 627.5/100,000 A total of 5,171 deaths have been		Dr Kevin Kelleher

	Some private facilities are being supported with Public Health input and HSE staffing. Communicating with HIQA with regard to Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures. Watchful of case numbers/disease spread/emerging trends.		
7. ACUTE OPERATIONS			
	AO'C: Sites remain very busy, responding to significant service demands and capacity challenges. Two sites of concern, continuous engagement and support being provided. Working closely with model three sites. Continuing to deal with increased numbers of trolleys, delayed transfers of care and home support encounters. MC: Acute hospitals - number of hospital acquired cases = down from 49 to 43. Number of cases of acute hospital staff are down from 169 to 100. Outbreaks continue in some hospitals - better outcomes seen compared to January. Community – nursing home outbreaks with less morbidity reported.		Anne O'Connor Dr Martin Cormican

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8. TESTING & TRACING	8. TESTING & TRACING			
	Testing: Past week figures are up by 25-35% on prior week. 17% increase over weekend. 12/09/2021 – over 15,000 referrals. 13/09/2021 – approximately 30,000 referrals. Testing system is challenged – 3 area reached full capacity yesterday. Close contacts = 3.7 compared to 3.3. School volume significant. 13/09/2021 = 255 new Primary schools and 166 new Secondary schools taken into the system. Year to date = over 1,800 Primary school and 962 secondary schools. School system process changed to speed up referral and validation to get individuals into the testing system. Tracing: Challenged with the current referral volume/calls required/scheduling of tests. Testing capacity = 20,000. Staff deployment considered - NAS dealing with outbreak testing. Volume and capacity extension under constant review.		Niamh O'Beirne
