	LD: Summary of the last 14-day period (up to 05Dec2021). Case numbers – 62,612 representing a 3.7% increase from 60,309 cases in the preceding 14-day period. National incidence – 3.7% increase from 1,266 to 1,314 per 100k compared to previous 14-day period. Median age 31yrs. 73% of cases are <45yrs. Hospital admissions - 515 representing a 6% decrease, compared to 669 in the previous reporting period. ICU admissions – 17 compared to 31 in the previous reporting period. 	Capacity has increased to 224K and it is planned to reach 245k per week by end of December (This capacity was 147k per week in October).		
	Antigen testing: – 125k tests were reported through the public portal Schools: – At commencement of the scheme, 12k tests were dispatched to schools. This figure has stabilised with dispatch rates running between 2-3k per day		
	Vaccinations: – over one million 3 rd doses administered to date. Booster vaccinations for >50 cohort will commence on Thursday 9 th December.
