In recent days, there has been an increase in GP, school and close contact referrals for testing, with 11,000 referrals yesterday. Report being developed to capture the reasons why people are attending walk-in testing services - will be available this week. Antigen testing in schools, aim to commence in next 1-2/52. Online portal for self-referral for testing still being built and should be ready for use in May 2021. 		
9.VACCINATIONS	DMcC: 1.4M doses have been administered, of which >1m are first doses. 26 vaccination centres have now opened, with 4 more centres due to open this week. Work on-going with NAS providing vaccinations to people who are housebound. Call centre has been established to assist management of same.		Damien McCallion
