

Travel Guidelines

If you arrive into Ireland from a location that is not a [green region](#), you will have to restrict your movements for 14 days.

Passenger Locator Form

By law, if you arrive in Ireland from overseas you will need to fill in a form called the Covid-19 Passenger Locator Form.

This form can be filled out before you travel. If you need help, let border personnel know when you arrive in Ireland.

Why you need to complete this form

Health authorities may use your details to contact you. This is to verify your location in the country.

It will also help [contact tracers](#) get in touch with you if there is a confirmed case of coronavirus on your flight or ferry.

Green regions

In line with the EU traffic lights approach, travellers from [green regions](#), or those arriving from Northern Ireland, are not asked to restrict their movements. Currently, all passengers entering Ireland from [orange, red, and grey regions](#) are requested to restrict their movements for 14 days.

Arriving to Ireland from a green region

Anyone arriving to Ireland from a green region will not have to restrict their movements.

Restrict your movements for 14 days



People who arrive in Ireland from overseas will need to restrict their movements for 14 days unless they are coming from a green region.

This includes:

- > Irish citizens coming home
- > people with no symptoms
- > people who have tested negative for the virus in another country

Restricting your movements means staying at home and avoiding contact with other people and social situations as much as possible.

Do not:

- > go to work
- > use public transport
- > visit others
- > meet face-to-face with anyone who is at [higher risk from coronavirus](#)
- > go to the shop unless absolutely necessary - [wear a face covering](#) if you do

You may be contacted during the 14 days after you arrive in Ireland. This is to check that you are at the address you gave on the Covid-19 Passenger Locator Form.
