Non-Compliance	Copies of Certificate of current registration of some of the nursing staff were not available for inspection.
Required Action	A record of current registration for all nursing staff must be available. .
Timescale	Immediately

Regulation number	Article 29 (a) The registered proprietor and the person in charge of the nursing home shall:— (a) make adequate arrangements for the recording, safekeeping, administering and disposal of drugs and medicines
Non-Compliance	A medication was recorded by the nurse on duty as given when it was not yet administered.
Required Action	Ensure that recording of administered medicines is only done after medicines have been directly administered to the residents by the nurse on duty.
Timescale	Immediately
