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Summary Findings of Current Nursing Home Inspection	 Under Care & Staffing the nursing home was compliant with 21 out of 21 regulations. On the basis of this inspection and under current nursing home regulations, the inspection team would consider that the nursing home provides a good standard of Care and Staffing for residents. Under Management the nursing home was compliant with 27 out of 27 regulations. On the basis of this inspection and under current nursing home regulations, the inspection team would consider the nursing home to have a good standard of management. 		
	Under Physical Environment the nursing home was compliant with 10 out of 11 regulations.		
	On the basis of this inspection and under current nursing home regulations, there are issues that need to be addressed as outlined below in relation to the Physical Environment.		

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Based on the most recent nursing home inspection the nursing home is non-compliant under one or more regulations. For more details see below.

Regulation number Non-Compliance

Article 27.1 (a)

Planning Permission of the Nursing Home on the 8th November 1989 indicated that 'The requirements of the Chief Fire officer be ascertained and strictly adhered to in the development - in the interest of safety and the avoidance of fire hazard'. A Condition was placed on the Nursing Home by the Assistant Chief Fire Officer on the 11th January 1990 specifying that 'Non-ambulant patients to be confined to ground floor'. This was highlighted in previous Inspection Reports dated 06/02/07, 02/08/07 and correspondence from the Inspectorate dated 26/06/07. During inspection, Designated Officers noted that there was one nonambulant resident residing on the first floor of the Nursing Home. Following discussion with the Person In Charge of the Nursing Home, the Designated Officers were informed that this condition was placed due to the fact that there was no fire escape stairway available on the first floor. These adaptations have been undertaken and there are now fire escape stairways on both sides of the building. However, there was no written evidence available to indicate that the Nursing Home was subsequently inspected by the Fire Officers and that the condition was lifted.

Non-Compliance

Required Action

The Designated Officers acknowledge the letter was sent by the Registered Proprietor to the Fingal County Council Fire Section on the 16/08/07 with regard to this issue and that a receipt of acknowledgement was received from the Assistant Chief Fire Officer on the 17/08/07, indicating that the issue is currently being considered. On the day of the inspection, it was noted that there hasn't been any reply from the Fingal County Council Fire Section since date of the last correspondence. While the Designated Officers acknowledge Resident **'s relative's refusal in relocating the resident to the ground floor, please be advised that the Inspectorate must consider the Condition placed by the Assistant Chief Fire Officer to still be in place until the Registered Proprietor of the Nursing Home provides to the Designated Officers a legitimate confirmation that the Condition is officially removed.
