

Ambulance Officer (Quality, Safety & Risk Manager) Grade Code 6122

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section 22 of the Health Act 2004, I hereby approve the qualifications, as set out hereunder, for the appointment and continuing as **Ambulance Officer (Quality, Safety & Risk Manager)** in the HSE.

1. Professional Qualifications, Experience, etc

- (a) Eligible applicants will be those who on the closing date for the competition:
 - (i) Are currently registered in the EMT, Paramedic or Advanced Paramedic Division of the Register maintained by the Pre Hospital Emergency Care Council. (www.phecit.ie) or entitled to be so registered.

And

(ii) Possess the National Qualification in Emergency Medical Technology and the minimum PHECC EMT Practitioner's Licence.

And

(iii) Are the holder of a full unendorsed Class B & full unendorsed Class C1 driving licence.

And

(iv) Have significant supervisory/managerial experience, ideally in managing emergency services, including ambulance services.

And

(v) Have demonstrated capability in operational planning and in effectively implementing change and improving services.

And

(b) Candidates must possess the requisite knowledge and ability, (including a high standard of suitability and management ability), for the proper discharge of the duties of the office.

2. Annual registration

Practitioners must maintain annual registration in the EMT, Paramedic or Advanced Paramedic division of the register maintained by the Pre Hospital Emergency Care Council.

3. <u>Age</u>

Age restriction shall only apply to a candidate where s/he is not classified as a new entrant (within the meaning of the Public Service Superannuation (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 2004). A candidate who is not classified as a new entrant must be under 65 years of age on the first day of the month in which the latest date for receiving completed application forms for the office occurs.

4. Health

Candidates for and any person holding the office must be fully competent and capable of undertaking the duties attached to the office and be in a state of health such as would indicate a reasonable prospect of ability to render regular and efficient service.

5. Character

Candidates for and any person holding the office must be of good character.
