

Counsellor/Therapist, Senior (National Services)

Grade Code 3103

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section 22 of the Health Act 2004, I hereby approve the qualifications, as set out hereunder, for the appointment and continuing as a **Counsellor/Therapist**, **Senior (National Services)** in the Health Service Executive.

1. <u>Statutory Registration, Professional Qualifications, Experience, etc.</u>

a Candidates for appointment must:

(1)	Hold a qualification at Level 7 or higher on the QQI framework in a human science discipline (medical, psychological, social, educational) or hold a qualification at Level 7 or higher in a health and social care profession.
PLUS 2A OR 2B	
(2) A (i)	Hold a degree or post-graduate qualification in counselling, or psychotherapy recognised by one of the following, as appropriate:, the Irish Association for Counselling and Psychotherapy (IACP), or one of the five sections within the Irish Council for Psychotherapy (ICP)
AND	
(2) A (ii)	Have full accredited membership with one of the following: IACP or one of the five sections within ICP. Pre-accredited hours must include a minimum of 100 hours of one to one counselling/psychotherapy with adult clients under the supervision of an IACP / ICP accredited supervisor.
	OR
(2) B (i)	Hold a post-graduate qualification in counselling psychology or clinical psychology recognized by the Psychological Society of Ireland (PSI).
	AND
(2) B (ii)	Hold full membership <i>with</i> the clinical or counselling psychology division of the PSI.
	AND
(3)	All candidates must have a minimum of 3 years full time satisfactory, relevant, clinical experience post accreditation as a Counsellor/Psychotherapist providing counselling or psychotherapy in a variety of clinical contexts.
	AND
(4)	All candidates must have a minimum of one year's experience providing supervision and or case management to Counsellor/Therapists, trainees or other relevant professionals working with adults in a variety of settings.

AND

(b) All candidates must possess the requisite knowledge and ability, including a high standard of organisational and management ability for the proper discharge of the duties of the office.

2. Health

Candidates for and any person holding the office must be fully competent and capable of undertaking the duties attached to the office and be in a state of health such as would indicate a reasonable prospect of ability to render regular and efficient service.

3. Character

Candidates for and any person holding the office must be of good character.
