### **Laura Brennan HPV Vaccination Programme**

Dear Doctor,

Next week (23<sup>rd</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> January) is European Cervical Cancer Prevention Week, during which CervicalCheck (the National Cervical Screening Programme) will be promoting the importance of the HPV vaccine. The following week, commencing 30<sup>th</sup> January, will see live radio and digital audio ads and social media posts.

As part of this important initiative we would like to ask for your assistance in continuing to promote HPV vaccination in your discussions with eligible patients and their families.

The Laura Brennan HPV Catch-Up Vaccination Programme was launched on December 8th 2022 and will run until the end of December 2023. The Programme will be delivered in HSE immunisation clinics, not in GP surgeries or pharmacies due to its time-limited nature. The following groups are eligible for the HPV vaccine:

- Females (currently in 2nd year – 6th year of secondary school, or in age-equivalent special schools or educated at home) who have not received the HPV vaccine.
- Males (currently in 2nd year – 4th year of secondary school/5th year if they did not do transition year, or in age-equivalent special schools or educated at home) who have not received the HPV vaccine.
- Unvaccinated females who have left second level education and are under 25 years of age on the date of vaccination.
