Re: Additions to the Working Visa/Work Authorisation Scheme

As you are aware, the scope of the Working Visa/Work Authorisation Scheme to facilitate the recruitment of non-European Economic Area (EEA - EU countries, Norway, Liechtenstein and Iceland) nationals was extended to include those with specific expertise in the medical, health and social care sectors for employment in the public health service in May 2002.

At that time, it was decided that the following range of professionals would be covered by the scheme:

Medical Practitioner, Dentist, Diagnostic or Therapeutic Radiographer, Dietician, Occupational Therapist, Orthoptist, Medical Physicist, Psychologist, Speech and Language Therapist, Social Worker, Medical Scientist, Physiotherapist, Hospital Pharmacist, ECG Technician, Neurophysiological Measurement Technician, Cardiac Catheterisation Technician, Audiologist, Biochemist.

It has now been agreed that the list should be extended to include Respiratory Technicians, Vascular Technicians and GI function technicians. These technicians obtain the same qualification as cardiac catherisation technicians and neurophysiological measurement technicians. The same strict procedures for the employment of persons from non-EEA countries will apply as for the other Health and Social Care Professions listed under the scheme.

Particular attention is drawn to the requirement by the employer to provide confirmation of the validity of the job offer and the employer's satisfaction regarding the individual's registration status to the visa-issuing mission as outlined on page 3 of the information
