I refer to our recent discussions in respect of the above matter and wish to set out the following offer from management:

- The revised sessional rate will be £189.00 per session.

- This rate of pay will be effective from 1 January 2002. (2)
- The current double rate of €221.70 payable for sessions carried out on Saturdays/Sundays will cease to apply and will be replaced with this new (3)
- The rate will be reviewed in two years from the effective date i.e. 1 (4) January 2004.
