I refer to our letter of 1 February 2001 and previous correspondence concerning your appeal against the decision of the South Eastern Health Board in relation to the determination of your pensinable remuneration.

You appealed the decision of the Board not to calculate your premium payments by reference to your basic salary plus your acting up allowances, thereby reducing your pensionable pay and your retirement lump sum and pension.

While the level of a person's premium payments will affect the amount of his/her superannuation entitlements, the calculation of premium payments for health board staff is subject to the pay policy and guidelines of the Department of Health and Children.

Accordingly, the Department of Health and Children were consulted in the matter and they have confirmed that premium pay should be based on basic pay plus acting up allowances as opposed to basic pay only. They have also indicated that they have asked the Health Service Employers Agency to clarify the matter for health boards.
