Subject: New Arrangements for the Issue of Work Permits

In response to recent negative developments in the labour market, the Tánaiste and Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment has introduced new arrangements for the issue of Work Permits with effect from 2 April 2002.

The new approach aims to make sure that all reasonable steps are taken to ensure that Work Permits are issued only in circumstances where an Irish worker is unable or unwilling to accept the job and that the job is then offered to the wider European Economic Association (EEA - which comprises the European Union, Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein) labour market before a non-EEA national is recruited. The requirement to offer the job to the EEA labour market prior to recruiting a non-EEA national is being implemented by requiring that all job vacancies are advertised by FAS for a four week period before an application can be made for a Work Permit.

In view of the current serious shortages of healthcare personnel, the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment has exempted key medical, health and social care professionals from the FAS rule as set out on the schedule attached.

To avoid uncertainty as regards membership of these professions and ensure consistent application of the new Work Permit rules, it will be necessary to furnish a copy of the letter of validation from the appropriate designated authority of the relevant overseas qualification (or in the case of medical or nursing personnel a letter of registration) in order to avail of the exemption and allow the Work Permit application to be processed.

The Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment has agreed to a streamlined processing procedure for the issuance of Work Permits in such circumstances. Hence, any application for a Work Permit in respect of one of the designated medical, health and social care professions will be processed within 15 working days of receiving a complete and valid application, including the validation/registration letter as appropriate. In order to enable the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment to distinguish applications in respect of health and social care personnel and consequently, to ensure their speedy processing, "Health

Professional" should be clearly written across the top of every application form sent (see example attached). Any applications received under this procedure without the necessary letter of validation/registration will be returned to the employer in question.

It is not envisaged that these new arrangements will lead to any additional delays in obtaining Work Permits for health and social care personnel given the new validation arrangements for therapy personnel and radiographers as set out in Circular No. 8/2002 dated 6 February 2002 and the streamlined processing procedure to be undertaken by the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment as outlined above.

You should note that work is ongoing to extend the terms of the existing fast-track Working Visa/Work Authorisation system to a broader range of medical, health and social care professionals and you will be kept informed of any new arrangements once they are finalised.




