As a consequence of ongoing discussions and negotiations with IMPACT on behalf of Psychologists employed in the health services the above claim was referred to the Adjudication Board for a full hearing.

I **attach** for your information the two reports of the Adjudication Board in relation to this matter dated 12<sup>th</sup> July 1999 and 17<sup>th</sup> January 2000 respectively. See Appendices I and II.

Please note that in Paragraph 6 of the Adjudication Report dated 12<sup>th</sup> July specific reference is made to "agreeing further productivity and flexibility measures which will reduce the costs of the implementation of this award".

In this context a management team will be established in order to implement such productivity and flexibility measures. It is imperative that such discussions commence as soon as possible in order to ensure that optimum flexibility in relation to the provision of psychology services is achieved.

In relation to the application of revised rates as and from 1<sup>st</sup> August 1996 please see Appendices III - VII.

In order to assist the assimilation aspect of the agreement Appendices VIII - XI refer.

Please note that the letter of sanction will issue from the Department of Health and Children in relation to the authorisation to pay the attached revised scales and the normal budgetary practice will prevail.

In the meanwhile I will brief you further in relation to the discussions regarding the implementation of the productivity flexibility measures as referred to above.

### FURTHER REPORT OF THE ADJUDICATION BOARD IN RESPECT OF A CLAIM BROUGHT BY IMPACT ON BEHALF OF PSYCHOLOGISTS EMPLOYED IN THE HEALTH SERVICES

The Board was asked to clarify the statement contained in paragraph 4 of its report dated 12<sup>th</sup> July 1999.

Having considered submissions from the parties the Board now believes that the most satisfactory approach is to implement the full Department of Education pay scales with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> August 1996.

In this context the Board reaffirms its view that Psychologists and Senior Psychologists in the health services should be assimilated to the prior point on the scale for Psychologists and Senior Psychologists in the Department of Education. The Board notes, however, the anomaly that would be created if service at the maximum of greater than one year was not reckoned for the purpose of assimilation. In this regard the Board recommends that individuals should be assimilated to a scale point or long service increment point based on a formula involving a deduction of one year from actual service at the maximum.

### REPORT OF THE ADJUDICATION BOARD IN RESPECT OF A CLAIM BROUGHT BY IMPACT ON REHALF OF PSYCHOLOGISTS EMPLOYED IN THE HEALTH SERVICES

- 1. The Board received written submissions from both sides in regard to this matter and held an oral hearing on the 26<sup>th</sup> of February 1999. The hearing was adjourned from that date to allow further discussions to take place between the parties.
- A resumed hearing took place on the 24th of May 1999. Supplementary written submissions were produced by both sides which set out the history of what had occurred since the original oral hearing. The Board notes that the management side now recognises that "Psychologists employed in the Health Service should be assimilated to the education scale."
- 3. The Board was informed that the only outstanding matters which required to be resolved by it were
  - (a) The date of implementation and
  - (b) The method of assimilation.
- 4. Having regard to the history of this matter the Board recommends that the date of assimilation should be 60% as of the 1<sup>st</sup> of December 1995 and 40% as of the 1<sup>st</sup> of July 1997.
- Again having regard to the circumstances of this case the Board recommends that assimilation should take place on the basis that psychologist and senior psychologists in the Health Services should be assimilated to the prior point on the scale for psychologists and senior psychologists in the Department of Education. For example a psychologist on point 8 on the Health scale should be assimilated at point 7 on the Education scale.

- The Board notes that at the resumed hearing of this matter Impact confirmed on behalf of the persons bringing this claim that they were willing to undertake further discussions with the management side with a view to agreeing further productivity and flexibility measures which will reduce the costs of the implementation of this award. The Board has arrived at its recommendations in regard to this matter having regard to this commitment given on behalf of the claimants and is satisfied having regard thereto that the claim comes within the parameters of the Programme for Competitiveness and Work.
- 7. In regard to the principal and director grades the Board recommends that the parties should have further discussions in regard to these grades which in all the circumstances the Board believe should lead to a successful outcome. If however this is not the case then any outstanding dispute in regard to these grades can be re-entered before the Board.
