Dear Mr Mulligan

I refer to our ongoing difficulties in relation to issues affecting clerical / administrative staff.

I also wish to refer to the Department of Health and Children's circular of 12th July 2002 to health boards directing that they cut "management / administration" posts and a subsequent reduction in their allocations.

Our members have balloted heavily in favour of industrial action as a result of the failure to satisfactorily address and resolve various issues affecting clerical / administrative staff as outlined in previous correspondence.

It has been decided as and from 23rd September 2002 to instruct our health service members in clerical / administrative grades not to do any work or engage in any work associated with a clerical, administrative or managerial post which is left vacant or unfilled for whatever reason. They also have been instructed to refuse to co-operate with any reorganisation or redistribution of clerical / administrative work until further notice.
